- A. CASE 1998: FROM 23 MARCH THROUGH 04 APRIL 1999, DURING JFA 99-1C, RECOVERY ELEMENT ONE (RE1) EXCAVATED TWO SITES POSSIBLY ASSOCIATED WITH CASE 1998 IN KAMPONG SOM DISTRICT, KOH KONG PROVINCE, KINGDOM OF CAMBODIA (KOC). THE SITES ARE HEREIN DESIGNATED 1998A AND 1998B. RE1 EXCAVATED

APPROXIMATELY 406 SQUARE METERS. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST CLOSED SITE 1998A ON 29 MARCH 1999 AND SUSPENDED OPERATIONS AT 1998B ON 4 APRIL 1999 DUE TO THE NEED FOR SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT FOR EXCAVATING A WET SITE. RE1 RECOVERED POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS AT SITE 1998A AND SITE 1998B. RE1 RECOVERED POSSIBLE MATERIAL EVIDENCE AT SITE 1998A. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST RECOMMENDS FURTHER EXCAVATION OF SITE 1998B.

BACKGROUND.

ON 15 MAY 1975, A THREE MAN USMC MACHINE GUN TEAM WAS TAKING PART IN A MISSION ON KOH (CAMBODIAN WORD FOR ISLAND) TANG (ISLAND), CAMBODIA, TO RESCUE THE CREW OF THE U.S. CONTAINER SHIP MAYAGUEZ. AFTER ALL FORCES HAD WITHDRAWN FROM THE ISLAND IT WAS DISCOVERED THAT THE THREE MARINES WERE MISSING. DUE TO THE HOSTILE SITUATION ON THE ISLAND, NO SEARCH WAS CONDUCTED FOR THE MISSING MEN.

B. ON 9 AND 10 MARCH 1999, A JOINT TEAM INTERVIEWED ONE WITNESS CONCERNING TWO AMERICANS, POSSIBLY ASSOCIATED WITH CASE 1998, WHO WERE BURIED ON THE KOC MAINLAND IN THE VICINITY OF SIHANOUKVILLE, AT 48P US 362 754 (SITE 1998A) AND AT US 354 742 (SITE 1998B), RESPECTIVELY (REF B).

PROJECT LOCATIONS.

5. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT AREA:

- THE PROJECT AREA ASSOCIATED WITH SITE 1998A IS Α. LOCATED ON THE GROUNDS OF THE VICTORYSIDE HOTEL IN SIHANOUKVILLE, KOH KONG PROVINCE, KOC. THE HOTEL GROUNDS ARE SLOPING FROM AN ADJACENT ASPHALT ROAD ON THE EAST SIDE TO KAMPONG SOM BAY ON THE WEST SIDE. THE SLOPE IS THE PROJECT AREA IS APPROXIMATELY TWENTY DEGREES. GENERALLY LOCATED IN THAT PART OF THE HOTEL GROUNDS WHICH IS BOUNDED ON THE NORTH SIDE BY A BROAD SIDEWALK LEADING FROM THE ROAD TO THE FRONT DOORS, ON THE EAST SIDE BY THE ROAD, ON THE SOUTH SIDE BY A LINE OF COCONUT TREES, AND ON THE WEST SIDE BY A STONE RETAINING WALL RUNNING IN A STRAIGHT LINE PARALLEL TO THE KAMPONG SOM BAY SHORELINE. THE HOTEL GROUNDS EXHIBITED A DEGREE OF NEGLECT WHEN THE PROJECT WAS BEGUN AND THERE WERE NO GUESTS IN RESIDENCE THE VEGETATION IN THE PROJECT AT THE HOTEL AT THAT TIME. AREA INCLUDED A LARGE HARDWOOD TREE, COCONUT TREES, AND THE TERRAIN IS RELATIVELY FLAT, SHOWING TALL GRASSES. SIGNS OF HAVING BEEN PREVIOUSLY IMPROVED BY GRADING, BUT SLOPES TOWARDS THE SHORELINE. THE SOIL WITHIN THE PROJECT AREA IS PREDOMINANTLY A SANDY CLAY.
- B. THE PROJECT AREA ASSOCIATED WITH SITE 1998B IS CATED ON THE BEACH IMMEDIATELY SOUTH OF THE KOH POS RESTAURANT. THE PROJECT AREA LIES BELOW THE HIGH TIDE LINE AMONGST SEVERAL LARGE BOULDERS. THERE IS NO SOIL DEVELOPMENT WITHIN THE PROJECT AREA, ONLY BEACH SAND. THE PROJECT AREA IS LARGELY REMOVED FROM THE PRIMARY LOCUS OF HUMAN ACTIVITY ON THE BEACH: HOWEVER, IT HAS BEEN FREQUENTLY USED AS A NATURAL LATRINE AREA BY BEACHGOERS OVER THE YEARS.

FIELD METHODS.

- A. THE TEAM EXCAVATED TWO SITES (1998A AND 1998B) IN RESPONSE TO WITNESS STATEMENTS CONCERNING THE BURIAL OF THE REMAINS OF AMERICAN SERVICE PERSONNEL. THE SITE 1998A WAS ALLEGEDLY A BURIAL LOCATION ON LAND. SITE 1998B WAS A BURIAL LOCATION IN THE LITTORAL ZONE ON A BEACH. THE TEAM USED A STANDARD SET OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL METHODS TO CONDUCT RECOVERY OPERATIONS ON SITE 1998A. THE RECOVERY METHODS EMPLOYED AT THE AQUATIC SITE 1998B ARE OUTLINED IN PARAGRAPH 6C.
- B. SITE 1998A. THE TEAM EMPLOYED A SET OF STANDARD ARCHAEOLOGICAL FIELD METHODS TO LOCATE AND EXCAVATE THE REPORTED HUMAN BURIAL AT SITE 1998A THAT INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING STEPS. THE TEAM ESTABLISHED A GRID TO FACILITATE SPATIAL CONTROL DURING THE COURSE OF THE EXCAVATION. THE TEAM SYSTEMATICALLY STRIPPED THE SOIL WITHIN THE EXCAVATION

THE TEAM PROCESSED ALL EXCAVATED SOIL THROUGH ONE-QUARTER INCH SCREENS. THE TEAM CUT CLEAN THE EXCAVATION FLOOR WITH TROWELS, SPRAYED IT WITH WATER, AND THEN PHOTOGRAPHED IT. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED AND RECORDED ALL EVIDENCES OF PRIOR DISTURBANCE OF THE SUBSOIL, SUCH AS PIT FEATURES. THE TEAM EXCAVATED ALL PIT FEATURES WITH SHOVELS AND TROWELS AND SCREENED ALL FEATURE-FILL THROUGH ONE-QUARTER INCH SCREENS. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST EXAMINED ALL MATERIALS RECOVERED DURING THE RECOVERY OPERATIONS. THE TEAM RETAINED MATERIALS THAT POSSIBLY CORRELATE TO THE CASE.

C. SITE 1998B. THE TEAM EMPLOYED METHODS IN THE RECOVERY OPERATION AT SITE 1998B THAT PERMITTED THE RECOVERY OF MATERIALS SUSPENDED IN WET SAND. THE TEAM SHOVELED OUT APPROXIMATELY FOUR CUBIC METERS OF SAND AND PROCESSED IT THROUGH ONE-OUARTER INCH SCREENS. THE TEAM NEXT USED A WATER PUMP WITH A REDUCED DISCHARGE HOSE TO WASH MUCH OF THE SAND REMAINING IN THE PROJECT AREA INTO A CUSTOM DESIGNED SCREEN THAT WAS PLACED AT THE END OF THE INLET THROUGH WHICH SEA WATER DISCHARGED FROM THE PROJECT AREA. THE TEAM PROCESSED APPROXIMATELY TEN CUBIC METERS OF SAND IN THIS MANNER. THE TEAM ATTEMPTED AT THE END OF THE JFA TO CONSTRUCT A DREDGE SYSTEM THAT WOULD ALLOW THE REMAINING ND TO BE SUCTIONED OUT OF THE PROJECT AREA AND INTO A ME-QUARTER INCH SCREEN. THE DREDGE SYSTEM FAILED DUE TO THE LACK OF AN APPROPRIATELY LARGE DIAMETER DREDGE. TEAM RETAINED ALL MATERIALS THAT RELATED TO CASE 1998B.

7. ARCHAEOLOGICAL FINDINGS:

A. THE TEAM RECORDED OBSERVATIONS AND COLLECTED MATERIALS DURING THE EXCAVATION OF THE TWO SITES. THESE RESULTS ARE DETAILED BELOW FOR THE RESPECTIVE SITES.

SITE 1998A. THE TEAM EXCAVATED A TOTAL OF THREE HUNDRED AND SIX SQUARE METERS DURING RECOVERY OPERATIONS AT SITE 1998A. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST DUG THREE 50X50 CENTIMETER TEST PITS ACROSS THE PROJECT AREA TO EVALUATE THE WITNESS TESTIMONY THAT THE HOTEL GROUNDS (INCLUDING THE PROJECT AREA) HAD BEEN GRADED BY A BULLDOZER AT LEAST TWICE SINCE 1975. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST DETERMINED THAT SOIL HAD BEEN STRIPPED OFF OF THE UPPER PART OF THE PROJECT AREA AND PUSHED DOWNSLOPE TO A STONE RETAINING WALL. INITIALLY EXCAVATED A 6X6 SQUARE METER EXCAVATION BLOCK THAT ENCOMPASSED THE LOCATION INDICATED BY THE WITNESS AS THE PLACE WHERE HE BURIED AN AMERICAN SERVICEMAN IN 1975. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED A SINGLE PIT FEATURE IN THE EXCAVATION FLOOR WHICH CORRESPONDS NEARLY EXACTLY IN TERMS OF SIZE, SHAPE, AND ORIENTATION TO THE WITNESS DESCRIPTION OF THE BURIAL PIT HE DUG IN 1975. THE TEAM EXCAVATED THE PIT FEATURE AND FOUND IT TO BE SHALLOW AND EMPTY. THE

ANTHROPOLOGIST INTERPRETED THIS FINDING TO BE THE RESULT OF THE GRADING ACTIVITY HAVING STRIPPED OUT THE BURIAL AND SPREAD THE REMAINS ACROSS THE SITE TOWARDS THE STONE RETAINING WALL. THE TEAM NEXT EMPLOYED A BACKHOE TO EXCAVATE OUT AN 18X13 METER EXCAVATION BLOCK. THE TEAM PROCESSED APPROXIMATELY NINETY-TWO CUBIC METERS OF SOIL THROUGH ONE-QUARTER INCH SCREENS. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED NUMEROUS ANIMAL REMAINS AS WELL AS POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS THAT WERE RECOVERED DURING THE RECOVERY OPERATION. THE ANIMAL REMAINS AND POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS WERE HIGHLY FRAGMENTED AND OF SMALL SIZE. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST MEASURED THE SOIL PH AND FOUND IT TO BE APPROXIMATELY 5.5. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST NOTED THAT THE ACIDITY OF THE SOIL APPEARED TO CREATE AN UNFAVORABLE ENVIRONMENT FOR BONE PRESERVATION. THE TEAM RECOVERED ONE POSSIBLE SET OF WIRE HANDCUFFS THAT COULD POSSIBLY RELATE TO CASE 1998. THE TEAM RETAINED THE POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS AND THE WIRE ARTIFACT.

C. SITE 1998B. THE TEAM EXCAVATED APPROXIMATELY ONE HUNDRED SQUARE METERS OF SAND DURING THE RECOVERY OPERATION AT SITE 1998B. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED SEVERAL ANIMAL REMAINS AND SOME POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS. THE TEAM RECOVERED NO OTHER MATERIALS THAT APPEAR TO RELATE TO CASE 1998.

A. THE TEAM RETAINED POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS AND A POSSIBLE SET OF WIRE HANDCUFFS FROM SITE 1998A.

B. THE TEAM RETAINED POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS FROM SITE OF TOO SMULL A 1998B.

- 10. ANALYST/LINGUIST COMMENTS. MATERIAL EVIDENCE FROM SITE 1998A CORRESPONDS TO WIRE LIGATURES AND HEAVY-DUTY WIRE HANDCUFFS RECOVERED DURING 98-1C OPERATIONS IN SIHANOUKVILLE IN AN AREA WHICH WORKERS HAD IDENTIFIED AS A KILLING FIELD.
- 11. EOD TECHNICIAN COMMENTS: NONE.
- ANTHROPOLOGIST CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS:
- THE ANTHROPOLOGIST WILL OFFER COMMENTS FOR THE TWO Α. SITES BELOW.
- THE SITE 1998A WAS EXCAVATED IN RESPONSE TO THE STATEMENTS (REF B) OF A WITNESS (MR. SON) WHO WAS FORMERLY A SOLDIER WITH THE KHMER ROUGE. MR. SON ALLEGEDLY BURIED AN AMERICAN IN A SHALLOW BURIAL PIT ON THE GROUNDS OF THE VICTORYSIDE HOTEL IN MAY, 1975. THE WITNESS DESCRIBED THE BURIAL PIT AS BEING ONE AND ONE-HALF METERS LONG, ONE-HALF METER WIDE, AND ONE-HALF METER DEEP. THE WITNESS PLACED A WOODEN STAKE IN THE PRECISE LOCATION HE BELIEVED TO BE THE

BURIAL LOCATION. THE WITNESS STATED THAT THE PROJECT AREA WAS GRADED AT LEAST TWICE SINCE 1975. THE TEAM EXCAVATED THE AREA INDICATED BY THE WITNESS AS THE LOCATION OF THE BURIAL PIT. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED A SINGLE PIT FEATURE IN THE EXCAVATION FLOOR, APPROXIMATELY TEN CENTIMETERS FROM THE WITNESS STAKE MARKER, WHICH WAS ONE AND ONE-HALF METERS LONG AND 0.7 METERS WIDE. THE TEAM EXCAVATED THE PIT FEATURE AND FOUND IT TO BE ONLY SEVEN CENTIMETERS DEEP AND EMPTY. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST FOUND DURING THE INVESTIGATION OF THE SITE AMPLE EVIDENCE THAT THE HOTEL GROUNDS HAD BEEN GRADED. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST INTERPRETED THE FINDINGS TO INDICATE THAT THE AMERICANS REMAINS HAD BEEN BULLDOZED AND SPREAD ACROSS THE PROJECT AREA. ALL OF THE PROJECT AREA WHICH COULD BE DISTURBED WAS EXCAVATED AND SCREENED IN AN ATTEMPT TO RECOVER WHATEVER HUMAN REMAINS WERE PRESENT. THE OBVIOUS DESTRUCTIVE POWER OF THE BULLDOZER COUPLED WITH SOIL CONDITIONS NOT CONDUCIVE TO BONE PRESERVATION MOST LIKELY ACCOUNT FOR THE SPARSE REMAINS RECOVERED. FURTHER WORK AT SITE 1998A IS NOT RECOMMENDED.

SITE 1998B WAS EXCAVATED IN RESPONSE TO THE STATEMENTS OF THE SAME WITNESS (MR. SON) DISCUSSED ABOVE FOR SITE 1998A. THE WITNESS STATED THAT HE PLACED THE BODY OF AN AMERICAN SERVICEMAN ON THE SAND AMONGST A SET 7 LARGE BOULDERS IN MAY 1975. HE WAS ABLE TO OBSERVE THE REMAINS OVER THE COURSE OF A MONTH FOLLOWING THE DEPOSITION OF THE BODY AT THAT LOCATION AND NOTED THAT THE REMAINS HAD NOT BEEN REMOVED BY TIDAL ACTION. TEAM EXCAVATED, THROUGH A VARIETY OF MEANS, SITE 1998B. POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS WERE RECOVERED. DUE TO THE COMPLEXITY OF EXCAVATING A SITE WITHIN THE LITTORAL ZONE OF A BEACH, THE SITE WAS TEMPORARILY CLOSED UNTIL A RECOVERY OPERATION CAN BE STAGED WHICH IS PREPARED FOR EXCAVATION OF A WET SITE. IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT A DREDGE SYSTEM BE USED THAT WILL ALLOW THE SAND MATRIX TO BE SUCTIONED OUT FROM AROUND THE ROCKS AND PUSHED OUT TO A SCREEN.

A MILITARY TYPE PONCHO WAS RECOVERED FROM SITE 2003C THAT IS POSSIBLY ASSOCIATED WITH THE INCIDENT. - E. BETWEEN 6 AND 14 DECEMBER 1992, A JOINT U.S./K.O.C. TEAM INVESTIGATED CASE 2003 ON TANG ISLAND. DURING THE INVESTIGATIONS THE TEAM RECOVERED POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS (REF E).
- F. FROM 9 TO 11 FEBRUARY 1993, DURING JFA 93-3C, A JOINT U.S./K.O.C. TEAM SURVEYED THE CRASH SITE OF THE CASE 2003 HELICOPTER. ON 14 MARCH 1999 A TRILATERAL KINGDOM OF CAMBODIA, SOCIALIST REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM, AND US TEAM INTERVIEWED A VIETNAMESE WITNESS WHO WAS STATIONED ON KOH TANG FROM APRIL 1982 TO FEBRUARY 1986 AS PART OF A VIETNAMESE OCCUPATION FORCE. THE WITNESS ALLEGED TO HAVE KNOWLEDGE OF AMERICAN REMAINS THAT WERE REMOVED FROM THE HELICOPTER CRASH SITE ASSOCIATED WITH CASE 2003 AND BURIED IN TWO LOCATIONS ON KOH TANG ISLAND IN THE VICINITY OF TS 965 396 (SITE 2003B) AND TS 962 392 (SITE 2003C), RESPECTIVELY (REF R).

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT AREA.

- A. THE PROJECT AREA ASSOCIATED WITH SITE 2003 IS LOCATED REPROXIMATELY 10 METERS INLAND FROM THE POINT OF HIGH TIDE, IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO THE LOCATION OF THE HELICOPTER CRASH (KNIFE 31) ASSOCIATED WITH CASE 2003. THE VEGETATION WITHIN THE PROJECT AREA INCLUDED LARGE HARDWOOD TREES SPACED INTERMITTENTLY THROUGHOUT, LARGE COCONUT TREES, AND THICK UNDERBRUSH. THE SOIL WITHIN THE AREA IS POORLY DEVELOPED, CONSISTING MAINLY OF BEACH SAND WITH MODEST -O AND -A HORIZONS. THE TERRAIN IS GENERALLY FLAT, WITH A DROP IN ELEVATION OF APPROXIMATELY ONE METER WHERE THE BEACH SLOPES DOWN TO THE WATER'S EDGE.

SITE 2003B. THE PROJECT AREA WAS OVERGROWN WITH SMALL HARDWOOD TREES, COCONUT TREES, DENSE SCRUB VEGETATION, AND GRASSES WHEN THE PROJECT WAS BEGUN. THE SOIL IN THE PROJECT AREA WAS A SANDY CLAY AND INCLUDED NUMEROUS ROCKS OF VARYING SIZES AS A NATURAL INCLUSION. THE FOUNDATION (PLATFORM TYPE) OF A FORMER VIETNAMESE COMMUNICATIONS BUILDING WAS CLEARLY VISIBLE ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE PROJECT AREA ONCE THE VEGETATION WAS CLEARED AWAY.

6. FIELD METHODS.

- A. THE TEAM EXCAVATED THREE SITES (2003, 2003B, AND 2003C) IN RESPONSE TO WITNESS STATEMENTS CONCERNING THE BURIAL OF THE REMAINS OF AMERICAN SERVICE PERSONNEL. THE THREE SITES, 2003, 2003B, AND 2003C, WERE ALLEGEDLY BURIAL LOCATIONS ON LAND.
- THE TEAM EMPLOYED A SET OF STANDARD ARCHAEOLOGICAL FIELD METHODS TO LOCATE AND EXCAVATE REPORTED HUMAN BURIALS IN SITES 2003, 2003B, AND 2003C THAT INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING THE TEAM ESTABLISHED A GRID TO FACILITATE SPATIAL CONTROL DURING THE COURSE OF THE EXCAVATION. THE TEAM SYSTEMATICALLY STRIPPED THE SOIL WITHIN THE EXCAVATION UNIT AWAY TO A DEPTH OF TWENTY CENTIMETERS USING SHARPENED SHOVELS. THE TEAM PROCESSED ALL EXCAVATED SOIL THROUGH ONE-QUARTER INCH SCREENS. THE TEAM CUT CLEAN THE EXCAVATION FLOOR WITH TROWELS, SPRAYED IT WITH WATER, AND THEN PHOTOGRAPHED IT. E ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED AND RECORDED ALL EVIDENCES OF PRIOR DISTURBANCE OF THE SUBSOIL, SUCH AS PIT FEATURES. TEAM EXCAVATED ALL PIT FEATURES WITH SHOVELS AND TROWELS AND SCREENED ALL FEATURE FILL THROUGH ONE-QUARTER INCH SCREENS. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST EXAMINED ALL MATERIALS RECOVERED DURING THE RECOVERY OPERATIONS. THE TEAM RETAINED MATERIALS THAT POSSIBLY CORRELATE TO THE CASE.

7. ARCHAEOLOGICAL FINDINGS:

- A. THE TEAM DID NOT RECOVER ANY HUMAN REMAINS FROM THE THREE EXCAVATION SITES. THE TEAM RECORDED OBSERVATIONS AND COLLECTED MATERIALS DURING THE EXCAVATION OF THE THREE SITES. THESE RESULTS ARE DETAILED BELOW FOR THE RESPECTIVE SITES.
- B. SITE 2003. THE TEAM EXCAVATED A TOTAL OF 234 SQUARE METERS DURING THE RECOVERY OPERATION AT SITE 2003. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST WAS ABLE TO OBSERVE AS A RESULT OF THESE EXCAVATIONS A NUMBER OF DISTURBANCES IN THE PROJECT AREA. THE MOST NOTABLE DISTURBANCE IN THE PROJECT AREA IS A SERIES OF VIETNAMESE TRENCHWORKS THAT WIND IN A CURVILINEAR FASHION THROUGH THE PROJECT AREA. THE VIETNAMESE TRENCHWORKS ARE OBSERVABLE BOTH ABOVE GROUND, AS LINEAR DEPRESSIONS, AND BELOW GROUND, AS DARK LINEAR STAINS ON THE EXCAVATION FLOOR. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST ALSO OBSERVED ONE FEATURE THAT APPEARS TO BE AFFILIATED WITH A DOMESTIC STRUCTURE THAT PREDATES THE KHMER ROUGE OCCUPATION OF THE ISLAND, AND NUMEROUS FORMER TREE ROOT SYSTEMS. THE TEAM EXCAVATED THE VIETNAMESE TRENCHES IN SEVERAL

LOCATIONS AND EXCAVATED ALL SMALLER AREAS SHOWING SIGNS OF DISTURBANCE. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST DID NOT OBSERVE ANY SUBSURFACE FEATURES THAT APPEARED TO REPRESENT HUMAN BURIALS NOR ANY THAT APPEARED TO REPRESENT THE U-SHAPED KHMER ROUGE FIGHTING POSITIONS DESCRIBED BY BOTH CAMBODIAN WITNESSES. THE TEAM RECOVERED NUMEROUS ANIMAL REMAINS BUT NO HUMAN REMAINS NOR ANY MATERIALS THAT APPEAR TO RELATE TO THE TWO BURIALS ALLEGEDLY DUG IN THE PROJECT AREA. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST MEASURED THE SOIL PH AND FOUND IT TO BE APPROXIMATELY 6.6.

C. SITE 2003B. THE TEAM EXCAVATED A TOTAL OF EIGHTY-FOUR SQUARE METERS DURING THE RECOVERY OPERATION AT SITE 2003B. THE TEAM EXCAVATED A SINGLE EXCAVATION BLOCK THAT ENCOMPASSED THE ENTIRE AREA INDICATED AS THE LOCATION OF THE BURIAL BY THE WITNESS AS WELL AS AN ADDITIONAL FORTY-NINE SQUARE METERS SUCH THAT THE ORIGINAL AREA MARKED OFF BY THE WITNESS (THIRTY-FIVE SQUARE METERS) WAS GREATLY EXPANDED TO CORRECT FOR ANY ERRORS IN THE WITNESS' MEMORY. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED NUMEROUS PIT FEATURES IN THE PROJECT AREA. THE TEAM EXCAVATED ALL PIT FEATURES. THE TEAM RECOVERED LARGE QUANTITIES OF ANIMAL REMAINS AND OTHER GENERAL DEBRIS THAT RELATED TO THE REFUSE DISCARDED DURING THE OCCUPATION OF THE BARRACKS HOUSE. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED NO HUMAN REMAINS DURING THE RECOVERY

OPERATION AT SITE 2003B. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST MEASURED THE SOIL AND FOUND IT TO BE APPROXIMATELY 6.4.

SITE 2003C. THE TEAM EXCAVATED A TOTAL OF ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-TWO SOUARE METERS DURING THE RECOVERY OPERATION AT SITE THE TEAM EXCAVATED A SINGLE EXCAVATION BLOCK THAT ENCOMPASSED THE ENTIRE AREA INDICATED BY THE WITNESS AS THE LOCATION OF THE BURIAL AS WELL AS AN ADDITIONAL NINETY-SIX SQUARE METERS LAID OUT SUCH THAT THE PROJECT AREA WAS EXPANDED ON ALL SIDES IN CASE THE WITNESS' MEMORY OF THE EXACT BURIAL LOCATION WAS IN ERROR. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED SEVERAL PIT FEATURES AND OTHER SUBSURFACE DISTURBANCES IN THE PROJECT AREA. THE TEAM EXCAVATED ALL PIT FEATURES AND OTHER SUBSURFACE DISTURBANCES. THE TEAM RECOVERED NUMEROUS ANIMAL REMAINS BUT NO HUMAN REMAINS. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST MEASURED THE SOIL PH AND FOUND IT TO BE APPROXIMATELY 6.2. THE TEAM RECOVERED ONE PLASTIC MILITARY-TYPE PONCHO NEAR THE GROUND SURFACE THAT POSSIBLY CORRELATES TO THE CASE 2003C. THE PONCHO IS CONSISTENT WITH ONE DESCRIBED BY THE WITNESS AS HAVING BEEN USED TO WRAP AROUND THE REMAINS PRIOR TO BURIAL. THE PONCHO WAS NOT IN A PIT, NOR WERE ANY REMAINS RECOVERED WITH THE PONCHO. THE TEAM PHOTOGRAPHED THE PONCHO AND DISCARDED IT ON SITE.

8. MATERIAL EVIDENCE. THE TEAM PHOTOGRAPHED A PLASTIC MILITARY-TYPE PONCHO AT SITE 2003C. THE PONCHO WAS NOT RETAINED BY THE TEAM.

- 9. LIFE SUPPORT ANALYST COMMENTS. N/A.
- 10. ANALYST/LINGUIST COMMENTS. THE WITNESS FOR SITE 2003, MR. SOK (REF R), STATED ON BOTH INTERVIEW OCCASIONS THAT THE AREA OF EXCAVATION HAD BEEN PROFOUNDLY ALTERED BY VIETNAMESE OCCUPATION TROOPS DURING THE 1980S. HE STATED THE VIETNAMESE HAD DUG BOTH FIGHTING AND COMMUNICATIONS TRENCHES IN THE AREA OF THE KHMER ROUGE FIGHTING POSITIONS. RECOMMEND VIETNAMESE OCCUPATION TROOPS BE INTERVIEWED IN REFERENCE TO ANY HUMAN REMAINS WHICH MAY HAVE BEEN EXHUMED FROM THE FORMER KHMER POSITIONS. FURTHER INFORMATION PERTAINING TO THE BATTLEFIELD IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE BATTLE MIGHT BE OBTAINED BY INTERVIEWING FORMER KHMER ROUGE TROOPS WHO HAVE ENTERED GOVERNMENT CUSTODY.
- 11. EOD TECHNICIAN COMMENTS: NONE.
- 12. ANTHROPOLOGIST CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS.
- A. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST WILL OFFER COMMENTS FOR THE THREE SITES BELOW.
- SITE 2003 WAS EXCAVATED IN RESPONSE TO THE TESTIMONY OF A WITNESS (MR. SOK) WHO WAS REPORTEDLY A KHMER ROUGE SOLDIER STATIONED ON KOH TANG IN MAY, 1975. THE WITNESS STATED THAT HE BURIED TWO AMERICANS WHOSE BODIES WASHED ASHORE TE WEEK AFTER THEIR HELICOPTER WAS SHOT DOWN DURING THE MERICAN RESCUE OPERATION AT KOH TANG. THE BODIES WERE PLACED IN A KHMER ROUGE FIGHTING POSITION AND COVERED WITH SAND. WITNESS DESCRIBED THE FIGHTING POSITION AS U-SHAPED AND APPROXIMATELY ONE-METER DEEP. THE WITNESS STATED THAT THERE WERE THREE OR FOUR SUCH FIGHTING POSITIONS IN THE PROJECT AREA IN MAY 1975, AND DISPLAYED THESE LOCATIONS IN REFERENCE TO THE CRASHED HELICOPTERS, THE BEACH, AND THE KHMER ROUGE CAMP ON A SKETCH MAP. THE AMERICANS WERE ALLEGEDLY PLACED IN THE NORTHERNMOST SET OF FIGHTING POSITIONS. THE TEAM EXCAVATED 234 SQUARE METERS OF SOIL IN AN ATTEMPT TO LOCATE THE BURIALS DESCRIBED BY THE WITNESS. THE ANTHROPOLOGIST OBSERVED NO EVIDENCE IN ANY FORM THAT INDICATED THAT HUMAN BURIALS WERE PRESENT IN THE PROJECT AREA OR THAT U-SHAPED FIGHTING POSITIONS HAD EVER BEEN DUG IN THE PROJECT AREA. THERE ARE THREE PLAUSIBLE EXPLANATIONS FOR THESE RESULTS. THE FIRST IS THAT THE WITNESS HAS INDICATED THE WRONG AREA AS THE LOCATION OF THE FIGHTING POSITIONS. HOWEVER, WITH THE LOCATIONS OF THE HELICOPTER CRASHES POINTED OUT TO THE WITNESS ALONG WITH THE STILL-APPARENT COCONUT GROVE FORMERLY ASSOCIATED WITH THE KHMER ROUGE CAMP CLEARLY VISIBLE, IT IS DIFFICULT TO ACCEPT THAT THE WITNESS COULD BE IN ERROR BY A SPATIAL MARGIN LARGER THAN THAT COVERED BY THE EXCAVATION AREAS. THE SECOND EXPLANATION IS THAT THE EXTENSIVE DISTURBANCE OF THE AREA CAUSED BY THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE VIETNAMESE DEFENSIVE WORKS HAS COMPLETELY OBLITERATED ALL EVIDENCE OF KHMER ROUGE

FIGHTING POSITIONS. IF THIS EXPLANATION HAS MERIT, THEN IT IS LIKELY THAT THE VIETNAMESE ENCOUNTERED THE AMERICAN BURIALS DURING THEIR OCCUPATION OF KOH TANG DURING THE 1980'S. THE POSSIBILITY THAT THE VIETNAMESE HAVE INFORMATION AND/OR REMAINS THAT CORRELATE TO THE TWO BURIALS SHOULD BE PURSUED BY JTF-FA ANALYSTS. THE THIRD EXPLANATION IS THAT THE WITNESS IS SIMPLY NOT BEING TRUTHFUL WITH THE JOINT TEAM. IT APPEARS AT THIS TIME THAT THE MOST FRUITFUL AVENUE OF WORK WILL BE TO PURSUE FURTHER ANALYTICAL WORK WITH THE VIETNAMESE SOLDIERS WHO LIVED ON KOH TANG DURING THE OCCUPATION OF THE 1980'S. THE WITNESS WHOSE STATEMENT GUIDED THE EXCAVATIONS DURING 99-1C SHOULD BE INTERVIEWED NO FURTHER, AS IT APPEARS CERTAIN THAT HE HAS LITTLE ELSE TO OFFER OTHER THAN SPECULATION AS TO THE BURIAL LOCATIONS. FURTHER RECOVERY WORK AT SITE 2003 SHOULD BE PURSUED ONLY IN LIGHT OF NEW, COMPELLING INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM NEW, RELIABLE SOURCES.

C. SITE 2003B WAS EXCAVATED IN RESPONSE TO THE STATEMENTS OF A VIETNAMESE WITNESS (MR. HUNG) WHO ALLEGEDLY RECOVERED THE REMAINS OF AMERICAN SERVICEMEN FROM THE HELICOPTER CRASH SITE IN THE WATER AT THE NORTHEAST END OF KOH TANG. THE WITNESS POINTED TO THE LOCATION OF THE CASE 2003 CRASH SITE AS THE PLACE WHERE HE RECOVERED THE REMAINS. THE WITNESS STATED THAT SOME OF THE REMAINS WERE BURIED IN

SMALL PIT IN THE YARD OUTSIDE OF THE BARRACKS HOUSE WHERE LIVED AT THE TIME (APPROXIMATELY 1986). THE WITNESS GUIDED THE TEAM TO THE LOCATION OF THE BARRACKS HOUSE AND POINTED TO THE APPROXIMATE LOCATION OF THE BURIAL PIT, SAID BY THE WITNESS TO BE WITHIN TWO TO THREE METERS OF THE HOUSE. HE ALSO NOTED THAT A VIETNAMESE FISHERMAN WAS BURIED IN THE SAME VICINITY. THE TEAM CLEARED THE PROJECT AREA AND LOCATED THE FOUNDATION OF THE BARRACKS HOUSE WHICH WAS WHERE THE WITNESS INDICATED IT SHOULD BE. THE TEAM EXCAVATED A LARGE AREA THAT ENCOMPASSED THAT INDICATED BY THE WITNESS AS THE LOCATION OF THE BURIAL PIT. SEVERAL PIT FEATURES WERE OBSERVED AND EXCAVATED, BUT NONE CONTAINED HUMAN REMAINS. SOME OF THE PITS WERE EMPTY. THE SOIL CONDITIONS IN THE SITE ARE FAVORABLE FOR PRESERVATION OF BONE (NEUTRAL PH, WELL DRAINED). THERE ARE THREE PLAUSIBLE EXPLANATIONS FOR THE LACK OF HUMAN REMAINS IN THE PROJECT AREA. FIRST IS THAT THE WITNESS DOES NOT REMEMBER WHERE THE REMAINS WERE BURIED. THIS EXPLANATION IS CONTRADICTED BY THE WITNESS' MEMORY OF THE PRECISE LOCATIONS OF THE HELICOPTER CRASH SITE, THE BARRACKS HOUSE, AND THE COMMUNICATIONS BUILDING (SEE BELOW). THE SECOND EXPLANATION IS THAT OTHER VIETNAMESE SOLDIERS EXHUMED THE REMAINS WITHOUT THE THIRD EXPLANATION IS THAT THE THE WITNESS' KNOWLEDGE. WITNESS IS NOT BEING TRUTHFUL WITH THE JOINT TEAM. EXPLANATION IS IMPOSSIBLE TO SUPPORT OR DENY GIVEN CURRENT INFORMATION. IT APPEARS THAT THE MOST REASONABLE AVENUE

OF WORK TO FOLLOW IS TO CONDUCT FURTHER ANALYTICAL WORK WITH VIETNAMESE SOLDIERS WHO WERE STATIONED ON KOH TANG IN THE 1980'S TO DETERMINE IF ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL EXHUMED THE AMERICAN REMAINS BURIED OUTSIDE OF THE BARRACKS HOUSE.

SITE 2003C WAS EXCAVATED IN RESPONSE TO STATEMENTS FROM A VIETNAMESE WITNESS, THE SAME AS REPORTED ABOVE FOR THE WITNESS SAID THE REMAINS OF AN AMERICAN SITE 2003B. SERVICEMAN WERE RECOVERED FROM A HELICOPTER CRASH SITE AND BURIED IN THE YARD OF A VIETNAMESE COMMUNICATIONS BUILDING. THE WITNESS STATED THAT THE REMAINS WERE WRAPPED IN A PLASTIC PONCHO AND BURIED IN A PIT IN THE YARD OFF THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE BUILDING. THE WITNESS SUCCESSFULLY LOCATED THE BUILDING FOUNDATION IN AN AREA OF DENSE UNDERGROWTH AND POINTED OUT THE GENERAL LOCATION OF THE THE TEAM EXCAVATED A LARGE EXCAVATION AREA OFF BURIAL PIT. THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE BUILDING FOUNDATION. ANTHROPOLOGIST NOTED SEVERAL PIT FEATURES. THE TEAM EXCAVATED THE FEATURES AND FOUND THEM TO BE LARGELY EMPTY. THE LACK OF HUMAN REMAINS IN THE PROJECT AREA CAN BE EXPLAINED WITH THE SAME PLAUSIBLE EXPLANATIONS OFFERED ABOVE FOR SITE THE SAME RECOMMENDATIONS APPLY TO SITE 2003C. 2003B. FURTHER ANALYTICAL WORK WITH THE VIETNAMESE SOLDIERS FROM KOH TANG APPEARS TO HOLD THE GREATEST PROMISE FOR RESOLVING THIS CASE.

- (U) ON 15 MAY 1975, A CH53A HELICOPTER, INVOLVED IN THE RESCUE OF THE CREW OF THE 55 MAYAGUEZ, WAS HIT BY ANTI-AIRCRAFT FIRE AND CRASHED NEAR THE SHORELINE OF KOH TANG ISLAND, CAMBODIA. THE HELICOPTER, SERIAL NUMBER 925, CRASHED IN THE VICINITY OF GRID COORDINATES TS 965 400. TWENTY SIX PERSONNEL (FOUR USAF CREW MEMBERS, TWENTY USMC AND TWO NAVY PASSENGERS) WERE ONBOARD THE HELICOPTER AT THE TIME OF THE INCIDENT. THIRTEEN PERSONNEL WERE RESCUED AT SEA BY SEARCH AND RESCUE (SAR) TEAMS. FURTHER SAR EFFORTS WERE NOT POSSIBLE DUE TO THE HOSTILE ENVIRONMENT. THOSE NOT RESCUED ARE CURRENTLY CARRIED IN THE STATUS OF DEAD, BODIES NOT RECOVERED.
- (U) AN OVERWATER/AT-SEA CASUALTY RESOLUTION OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD OF JULY THROUGH SEPTEMBER 1973 TO DETERMINE THE FEASIBILITY/DESIRABILITY OF EXPANDING SUCH OPERATIONS TO BE USED IN CASES SUCH AS THIS. BASED ON THE COMBINED FACTORS OF COST AND LACK OF ANY POSITIVE RESULTS WHATSOEVER, THE AT-SEA OPERATIONS WERE TERMINATED. LT VANDECED ES CURRENTLY CARRIED IN THE PRESUMPTIVE STATUS OF DEAD, REMAINS NONRECOVERABLE.

(U) THE SOURCE PROVIDED INFORMATION CONCERNING THE LOCATION, CIRCUMSTANCES OF LOSS AND TIME FRAME OF THE INCIDENT INVOLVING REFNO 2003. (REF 5)

16 April 1991

(U) THE SOURCE OF THIS REPORT PROVIDED THE NAME, SERVICE NUMBER AND BRANCH OF SERVICE WHICH CORRELATES TO PRIVATE FIRST CLASS RICHARD W. RIVENBURGH, REFNO 2003-0-07. THE SOURCE ALSO ACCURATELY DESCRIBED THE LOCATION OF THE AIRCRAFT WRECKAGE ON THE BEACH AT KOH TANG ISLAND, CAMBODIA. (REF 6)

15 December 1995

SOURCE PROVIDED INFORMATION REGARDING THE DISCOVERY OF THE ALLEGED REMAINS AND ID TAGS OF TWO U.S. SERVICEMEN WHO DIED AS A RESULT OF AN UH1H HELICOPTER CRASH NEAR THE VIETNAM-CAMBODIA BORDER. SOURCE REPORTED ID TAG INFORMATION CORRELATES WITH REFNO 2003-0-06 AND 2003-0-09, BASED ON NAME, SSN AND BRANCH OF SERVICE. HOWEVER, THE INCIDENT LOCATION AND AIRCRAFT TYPE DO NOT CORRELATE TO CASE 2003. (REFS 11 & 12)

25 January 1996

SOURCES HAD A SMALL BAG OF ALLEGED REMAINS THEY REPORTEDLY FOUND ON TANG ISLAND IN JUN 95. THE SOURCES WERE SEEKING COMPENSATION AND KEPT THE ALLEGED REMAINS. INCONSISTENCIES IN THEIR STORY SUGGESTS IT MAY BE A FABRICATION. (REF 13)

25 July 1996

PROBABLE CORRELATION IS BASED ON THE LOCATION AND CIRCUMSTANCES OF LOSS PROVIDED BY THE SOURCES. THE CAMBODIAN SOURCE PROVIDED SECOND HAND INFORMATION HE REPORTEDLY OBTAINED FROM HIS BROTHER CONCERNING THE BURIAL LOCATION OF ALLEGED REMAINS ON TANG

ISLAND. A FEW DAYS AFTER THE ATTACK ON TANG ISLAND, THE SOURCE'S BROTHER REPORTEDLY BURIED TWO CAMBODIAN AND FOUR AMERICAN BODIES IN A U-SHAPED FIGHTING POSITION NEAR THE EASTERN BEACH OF TANG ISLAND. (REF 16)

PROBABLE CORRELATION IS BASED ON THE LOCATION AND CIRCUMSTANCES OF LOSS PROVIDED BY THE SOURCES. THE CAMBODIA SOURCE ENTERED DETACHMENT FOUR WITH HEARSAY INFORMATION CONCERNING THREE AMERICAN SOLDIERS ALLEGEDLY KILLED BY THE KHMER ROUGE ON TANG ISLAND ONE WEEK AFTER THE MAYAGUEZ INCIDENT. THE SUB-SOURCE REPORTED KHMER ROUGE SOLDIERS CAME ACROSS THE THREE AMERICANS HIDING IN A GROUP OF BOULDERS IN THE JUNGLE TO THE EAST OF WHERE THE HELICOPTERS HAD LANDED, PRESUMABLY THE WESTERN BEACH LANDING ZONE. THE SUB-SOURCE ALLEGEDLY SAID THE BODIES WERE NOT BURIED AND WERE LEFT AMONGST THE BOULDERS. (REF 17)

15 July 1997

FROM 28 OCT TO 12 NOV 95 DURING JFA 96-1C, RE1 EXCAVATED THE CRASH SITE ASSOCIATED WITH CASE 2003 AT KOH TANG ISLAND. RE1 RECOVERED APPROXIMATELY 139 POSSIBLE HUMAN BONE FRAGMENTS, 9 POSSIBLE HUMAN TEETH WITH APPARENT RESTORATIONS, AND 13 POSSIBLE HUMAN TEETH WITHOUT APPARENT RESTORATIONS. ONE WITNESS PRESENTED REMAINS TO RE1 TO INCLUDE FOUR POSSIBLE HUMAN BONE FRAGMENTS AND ONE POSSIBLE HUMAN TOOTH. RE1 RECOVERED NUMEROUS PIECES OF PERSONAL EFFECTS AND EQUIPMENT PARTS. THE SITE WAS CLOSED AT 1136 HOURS ON 12 NOV 95. (REF 18)

FROM 28 OCT TO 12 NOV 95, RE1 EXCAVATED THE CASE 2003 CRASH SITE AT 48PTS 96439 40716 ON TANG ISLAND, KAMPOT PROVINCE, KINGDOM OF CAMBODIA. THIS CRASH SITE HAS PREVIOUSLY BEEN CONFIRMED AS BEING THE CASE 2003 CRASH SITE. JTF-FA ANALYSIS INDICATES THE ITEMS RECOVERED DURING THIS JFA CAN BE CORRELATED TO A CH-53 HELICOPTER AND INDICATE SOME CREWMEMBERS AND/OR PASSENGERS WERE ONBOARD THE AIRCRAFT WHEN IT CRASHED. (REF 19)

THE TEAM INVESTIGATED A CAVE ON THE SOUTHERN TIP OF THE ISLAND AT GRID COORDINATE TS973357 WHERE INFORMATION FROM PREVIOUS JOINT FIELD ACTIVITIES SUGGESTED AN ALLEGED GRAVE MIGHT EXIST. THE CAVE MEASURED 3 METERS

HIGH, 3 METERS WIDE, AND 15 METERS DEEP; NO EVIDENCE OF A GRAVE OR REMAINS WERE FOUND INSIDE. THE UNDERWATER SURVEY LOCATED NUMEROUS PIECES OF WRECKAGE, PORTIONS OF A SURVIVAL VEST, A SMALL PORTION OF A M-16 RIFLE AND A 40MM GRENADE. THE SURVEYSUGGESTED ADDITIONAL WRECKAGE LAYS UNDER THE SAND. THE SITE WAS RECOMMENDED FOR AN UNDERWATER RECOVERY; HOWEVER, SUCH AN OPERATION IS BEYOND THE SCOPE OF JTF-FA OPERATIONS. CASE 2003 IS PENDING AN ASSESSMENT BY CINCPACFLT OF THE FEASIBILITY OF AN UNDERWATER RECOVERY. (REF 7)

21 July 1993

ON 3 MAR 92 JOINT U.S./CAMBODIAN INVESTIGATION/RECOVERY TEAM INVESTIGATED CASES INVOLVING THE 1975 MAYAGUEZ INCIDENT ON KOH TANG ISLAND. THREE ALLEGED GRAVES THAT WERE POINTED OUT BY A WITNESS, MR. TRAK KEL, FROM KOMPONG SOM CITY, WERE SYSTEMATICALLY EXCAVATED AT GRID COORDINATES US447731 WITH NEGATIVE RESULTS. IN ADDITION, A TOTAL OF EIGHT TEST PITS AND TRENCHES WERE DUG, WITH NO INDICATIONS THAT A BURIAL HAD EVER TAKEN PLACE IN THE AREA. (REF 8)

FROM 6-14 DEC 92, A JOINT U.S./CAMBODIAN INVESTIGATION/RECOVERY TEAM INVESTIGATED CASE 2003 ON KOH TANG ISLAND. DURING THE INVESTIGATION, THE TEAM RECOVERED FOUR INDIVIDUAL BONES AND A JAW FRAGMENT WITH TWO TEETH WHICH WERE POSSIBLE HUMAN REMAINS. DESPITE RECOVERY OF THE REMAINS, THE TEAM WAS UNABLE TO FIND ANY INFORMATION USEFUL IN CASE RESOLUTION. (REF 9)

30 June 1995

FROM 30 APR THROUGH 02 MAY 95, INVESTIGATION ELEMENT AND UNITED STATES NAVY SALVAGE TEAM CONDUCTED SURVEY OF CRASH SITE OF CASE 2003 ON TANG ISLAND, KOH KONG PROVINCE. ON 01 MAY, TEAM TRAVELLED TO TANG ISLAND, CONDUCTED SALAVAGE SURVEY AND RETURNED TO SIHANOUKVILLE. ON 02 MAY, TEAM RETURNED TO PHNOM PENH. (REF 10)

RE1 INTERVIEWED ONE OTHER WITNESS WHO REPORTED ONE POSSIBLE BURIAL LOCATION OF AN AMERICAN ON THE EASTERN SIDE OF TANG ISLAND. THE TEAMS DUG TEST PITS AT ALL REPORTED BURIAL LOCATIONS, BUT DID NOT FIND ANY REMAINS OR PERSONAL EFFECTS. (REF 15)

(U) ON 10 FEBRUARY 1993, A JOINT U.S./CAMBODIAN INVESTIGATION/RECOVERY TEAM (IRT) INVESTIGATED A CAVE ON THE SOUTHERN TIP OF THE ISLAND AT GRID COORDINATE TS973357 WHERE INFORMATION FROM PREVIOUS JOINT FIELD ACTIVITIES SUGGESTED AN ALLEGED GRAVE MIGHT EXIST. THE CAVE MEASURED 3 METERS HIGH, 3 METERS WIDE, AND 15 METERS DEEP; NO EVIDENCE OF A GRAVE OR REMAINS WERE FOUND INSIDE. RECOMMEND NO FURTHER FIELD ACTIVITY UNLESS NEW INFORMATION OR WITNESSES BECOME AVAILABLE. (REF 5)

21 July 1993

FROM 7-14 DEC 92, A JOINT U.S./CAMBODIAN INVESTIGATION/RECOVERY TEAM INVESTIGATED THIS CASE ON KOH TANG ISLAND. THE INVESTIGATION BEGAN ON THE WATER FRONT IN KOMPONG SAOM CITY, KAMPOT PROVINCE, IN AN ATTEMPT TO LOCATE WITNESSES WHO MAY HAVE FREQUENTED THE ISLAND WHILE FISHING OR DELIVERING FOOD. ON KOH TANG ISLAND, THE TEAM INTERVIEWED SEVERAL CAMBODIAN NAVY PERSONNEL CONCERNING CASE 2038. NO WITNESSES WERE ABLE TO PROVIDE INFORMATION USEFUL IN CASE RESOLUTION. (REF 6)

23 July 1996

ON 05 MAY 96 DURING JFA 96-3C, SEVERAL MEMBERS OF RECOVERY ELEMENT ONE (RE1) AND THEIR ROYAL GOVERNMENT OF CAMBODIA (RGC) COUNTERPARTS INVESTIGATED CASE 2038 ON TANG ISLAND. THE TEAM DID A SKIRMISH SEARCH OF THE WESTERN BEACH AREA BASED ON INFORMATION PROVIDED BY TWO FORMER MARINES WHO FOUGHT ON TANG ISLAND DURING THE 15 MAY 75 BATTLE. THE TEAM WAS ABLE TO LOCATE SEVERAL PIECES OF PERSONAL EQUIPMENT INCLUDING TWO HELMETS WITH LINERS, ONE CANTEEN, ONE LEFT BOOT, ONE PROTECTIVE MASK HOOD, SEVERAL NBC MASK FILTERS, TWO BURNED FLACK JACKETS, AND ONE PONCHO TYPE LITTER. THE TEAM DID NOT RECEIVE OR RECOVER ANY REMAINS WHILE INVESTIGATING THIS INCIDENT. (REF 7)

Report of Witness Interview Mr. Sok 9 March and 25 March, 1999

March 9, 1999

Mr. Ou Sok, 43 YOA, was interviewed regarding the events of 15 May, 1975. In 1975 Mr. Sok was a member of the 410th battalion was one of three individuals who was assigned to a horseshoe-shaped fighting position approximately twenty meters from the surf line. There were a number of fighting pits parallelling the beach, the exact number was hard to remember. He did emphatically state that there were four in his section, and that they were about five meters apart, close enough to shout at one another.

Approximately one hundred meters behind their pit was a small house for the men to sleep in during their off-duty hours. Their position was screened by a thin stand of scrub and grasses, but was unobscured by saplings or trees.

The battle commenced about mid-day from his recollections, when a large helicopter flew slowly over the island, and then came to a hover in which it slowly turned to face the beach and the position. The helicopter was immediately subjected to rifle and machinegun fire, then was hit by a rocket, which caused it to crash. A second helicopter was targeted by many weapons, to include at least three heavy machine guns. The guns tore off the helicopter's tail and caused it to crash in water more shallow than the first.

The first helicopter had many men attempting to swim in the water about one hundred to onehundred and fifty meters from the shore. The men wore bright orange (red) life jackets, and bobbed in the water, making excellent targets. Mr. Sok stated that the men were shot as they exited the helicopter by the tail ramp doors, or as they bobbed in the water. Every time the men's heads bobbed above the water, they were shot at by the Khmer Rouge troops on shore.

Mr. Sok said that the fighting was intense and that most of the trees in their area were shredded, especially the sapling behind their position which lost its branches and a large tree which was chopped off at a height of three meters. In March of 1999, the sapling was a large tree, and the sheared-off tree was located to the North-west of the position.

The Americans retreated from the island at night, and over the next week corpses washed up along the shore. Many were trapped in the rocks where they began to decompose. Mr. Sok buried two corpses in his now-abandoned fighting position. The men were wearing green combat uniforms, but no boots, or identification. One man had red hair, the other brown. They were both large and of a "powerful" build. They were both caucasian. There was no associated jewelry, weapons or personal effects. One corpse wore web gear, neither had helmets. The marines were buried in the ends of the horseshoe with their heads toward the sea, and the bodies at a depth of one meter. They were covered with sand and the position abandoned.

25 March, 1999

Mr. Sok was re-interviewed regarding the location of the fighting position following the excavation of the position and the immediate area by the team. He stated that he had been confused by the vegetation and that the remains could have been buried in another position located approximately seven meters from the first position. The new location was under a mound of sand and rocks approximately two and a half meters high.

Mr. Sok postulated the mound had been used for an anti-aircraft gun position by the Vietnamese. He also stated that the area of the original Khmer Rouge fighting position had been completely criss-crossed by communications trenches and fighting positions that the Vietnamese had built following their invasion of Cambodia. He believes that the Vietnamese found the remains in the first fighting position and exumed them.
